



CDV — Seated view of **George E. Plummer**, a San Francisco resident who joined with the Cal Hundred on December 10, 1862. He was promoted through the ranks to a 2nd Lieutenant's commission and was severely wounded at Rockville, MD on July 11, 1864. Recovering from his wounds, he rejoined the regiment and finished the war, mustering out in July 1865.

CDV is in excellent condition with minor clips on bottom corners for album. Backmark is "A.W.Anderson, Haverhill, Mass." with 2¢ revenue stamp. Collection #420. **SOLD**



CDV - This is one of the marquis images of the Cal Battalion, Captain **Charles C. Eigenbrodt**, holding his slouch hat and his hand on his hip, parting his frock coat. His broad moustache and stern countenance epitomize the tough and savvy persona of the Californians. Enlisted March 19, 1863 as Captain of Co. E, he was killed in action at Halltown, VA on August 25, 1864.

CDV is mint with Gurney & Son, NY backmark, crisp corners and excellent contrast and sharpness. Collection #519. **\$800**



CDV – Vignette bust view of **Charles F. Hammond**. He enlisted with the 2nd Mass Cavalry on February 1, 1863 with Company I. He was seventeen years old and working as a clerk, his fine hand signing the CDV "*Your friend, Ca. F. Hammond*" with a sweeping flourish at bottom. Hammond survived the war and mustered out in July 1865.

CDV is in near mint with vivid clarity and fine flourished hand signature. Backmark is "Bushby & Hart, Lynn, Mass.". Collection #134. **\$250**



CDV – Standing view of Captain **George A. Manning**, Company M of the Cal Battalion 2nd Massachusetts Cavalry.

CDV is in near mint condition with one small emulsion rub to left of Manning's face. Sharpness and contrast are excellent. Of particular interest if Manning's slouch hat resting at his right, a perfect match to the slouch hat in this collection bearing the signature of Rufus W. Smith of the same group of Californians. Excellent ink signature on verso, "*Capt. Geo A. Manning Cal Battalion 2d Mass Cav.*" Holyland backmark. Presence of 2¢ revenue stamp, combined with Manning's signature would indicate that this CDV was given prior to his capture in 1864. Collection #518. **\$1200**
